## Nash Parish Council Vacancy for Clerk/Responsible Financial Officer

Applications are invited for the part-time role of Parish Clerk/Responsible Financial Officer. An overlap period with the current clerk, John Hamilton, can be arranged so as to facilitate a handover. Previous experience is not essential as training is available if required.

The Clerk/Responsible Financial Officer is responsible for administration, correspondence, and finance including preparation of agendas and minutes; book-keeping; preparing and maintaining budgets; liaising with Aylesbury Vale District Council and Buckinghamshire County Council, local organisations, and Nash residents. The Council meets bi-monthly six times a year in the evenings and also holds the Annual Parish Meeting in May. The Clerk is expected to attend each of these meetings. The hours are flexible and are expected to average over the year about six hours per week. There will be a need to work from home with the Council providing a laptop and printer for this purpose.

Candidates should have access to the internet and be able to use Word and Excel (or suitable alternative packages) and also be self-motivated and able to work to deadlines.

The position is salaried at hourly rate of between £9.80 to £12, depending on experience.

## Nash Parish Council

Annual Parish Meeting. This took place on 17 May in the Village Hall. Ten residents attended in addition to Councillors. The Chairman presented on the work of the Parish Council over the last year and details of the presentation can be found on the Parish Council website. There was an update on the Nash Development Plan from Des Hickey.

Annual Parish Council Meeting. This also took place on 17 May immediately after the Annual Parish Meeting. Both Mike Williams and David Carter were re-elected as Chairman and Vice-Chairman respectively of the Parish Council. The Council's accounts and related documentation were each approved at the meeting and details of these can also be found on the Parish Council's website.

Nash Park, further unauthorised building activity and retrospective planning application. Residents will be aware that a third retrospective planning application has been submitted for Nash Park and in respect of the unauthorised works. The Parish Council have objected to the application and the Parish Council's submission can be found on the AVDC planning website. The Parish Council continue to press AVDC for clarification as to what action they are taking in respect of the unauthorised works (which were carried out in August 2017) and which are in breach of a High Court. AVDC say that they are continuing to work with their legal advisers on the matter but without providing any details of substance.

Planning application 17/04533/APP – 9 houses on land at Church Farm, 4 Stratford Rd. The Parish Council understand that a new planning officer has taken over the matter, he is unable at this stage to say when a decision will be made.

Play Around the Villages in Nash. This will take place on the afternoon of Tuesday 14 August in the recreation ground. It is a supervised play scheme for 1-11 year olds providing a wide range of play activities. Posters with further details will be displayed nearer the time.

The village annual litter collection. This was to have been held in March but had to be postponed owing to the weather. It will be rearranged in the Autumn and at a date to be announced.

Mobile Library service. Following public consultation, Buckinghamshire County Council decided on 20th April to end the Mobile Library service, with the final visits being due on 31st May 2018.

And finally. I have been Parish Clerk for five years and think it is now time to step down and allow someone else to take on the role (see advert elsewhere in the Newsletter). This is a challenging, interesting and varied position playing an important part in the life of the village. Do give it consideration, prior experience is not required and training and guidance is available if required. Meetings. The meetings of the Parish Council in 2018 will take place on 19 July, 20 September and 15 November. Meetings start at 7.30pm and all residents of Nash are welcome to attend and speak.

## <u>Nash NDP</u>

The Neighbourhood Development Plan committee were pleased to be able to update the Nash Parish Council on the state of the plan at the PC AGM on May 17th

The plan has had its first sally out into the outside world having gone through a phase termed "Screening" where the three statutory consultees – The Environment Agency, Historic England and Natural England gave their opinion on our work. A 28 day consultation period took place 05 March 2018 to 13 April 2018. We received the results in early May. The three statutory consultees were in agreement with the screening opinion outcome that a "Strategic Environmental Assessment" would not be required. This was good news as it would have slowed the process by a few months. They also had no objections to the NDP itself and were all happy to pass our NDP to the next stage. Again good news

The NDP team at AVDC also kindly volunteered to give our NDP an unofficial run through and came back with a number of recommendations to tighten up and restructure the plan. We are currently going through these but are very likely to adopt their recommendations.

The next legally-required stage is to send the plan out to a far wider set of people of interest. AVDC will advise us on the format this should take and provide us with a core list of people to contact. The Nash PC will add to this list. This has been delayed by the clash with the GDPR deadline - the reason we are all getting so many emails from bodies we hardly knew ever contacted us - which we all agree is best to let pass before we start contacting anybody. But as soon as that is over the next stage begins. Hopefully still all roughly on schedule.

### Nash Alert

Nash Alert is a small, free, email based communication system intended to give the residents in the parish of Nash, Buckinghamshire, news of incidents, events and items of interest which affect the village. It is independent of the parish council, village hall, the church, and all other organised bodies in the village. It supplements the Parish News which is sent free to residents bi-monthly. Nash Alert does not have a regular publishing date and information is sent at the editor's discretion when it becomes available.

Applications for membership may be made at any time to alertfornash@gmail.com. Membership is not limited to Nash residents but members living outside the parish boundary are included at the editor's discretion. Nash Alert is only available by email and requires storage of the email addresses of members in order to function. The only personal information held is the members name, email address, and postal address where the member lives in Nash: a postal address is held to allow the member to be contacted in the event of an email problem, or if events happen in, or information is needed from, a specific part of the village. Address information about non-Nash residents is limited to area only, such as Southend or Africa. Membership is confidential and no information about members will be passed to any other body or individual requesting it unless required by law. Messages from third parties will be passed on to members when the editor believes they are of interest.

#### **General Data Protection Regulations**

The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) took effect in the UK from 25 May 2018. It replaces the existing law on data protection (the Data Protection Act 1998) and gives individuals more rights and protection in how their personal data is used by organisations.

If you have previously requested the newsletter by email I will carry on sending it to you unless you ask to be removed from the mailing list.

If you contribute to the newsletter and have chosen to receive a reminder about the deadline I will continue to send this to you unless you ask to be removed from the mailing list.

## Bin collection days may be changing for many households

Aylesbury Vale District Council is making some improvements to its recycling and waste collection services. There are a number of changes that are planned and AVDC will be launching a public information campaign, starting early June and running throughout the summer.

Having recently invested £3.7m in a new state-of-the-art waste vehicle fleet, all recycling, general waste, food and garden waste collection rounds are currently being redesigned to improve capacity and fuel efficiency. Any changes to a customer's bin collection day will not come into effect until early September.

A letter explaining the day changes will be sent to all households across the Vale during mid-August, along with a new bin collection day calendar. The frequency of household collections **will not** change; with recycling and general waste collected on alternate weeks, garden waste collected fortnightly and food recycling collected every week.

The council will do all it can to make sure that customers have all the information they need so that the changes happen as smoothly as possible.


### Programme
