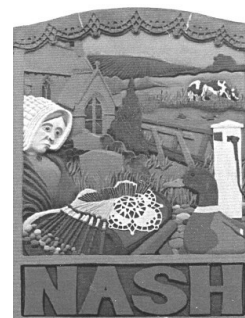

## **Reverend Gussie Walsh**

Gussie retired at the end of October and she and Mark have now moved out of the Rectory in Thornborough. We all miss her - many people were touched by her ministry and her willingness to join in activities. Each of "her" villages said their own farewells. Nash gave her a bouquet at her last Nash service – the Harvest Service – and then gave her a card signed by many residents and a cheque for £180 at a Benefice lunch in Nash Village Hall on 28 October. Gussie was very touched by this response and asked that her thanks be passed to all who had signed the card and contributed to her present.

## **Harvest**

Sixty-two people attended the Harvest supper and the auction of the donated produce on the Monday after the Harvest Service. It was a great evening with much laughter. The church collection, the tickets – all the food for the supper was donated – and the proceeds of the auction raised £738 (after deducting the cost of hiring the Hall). Half was sent as aid for the Philippines after the typhoon Mangkhut which had hit the area in mid-September. The other half was split between the Buckingham and Milton Keynes Food Banks. Thank you to all who contributed whether by donating produce or buying at the auction.

## **Church Yard/Church Clean and Gift Day**

Thank you to all who came and helped with tidying the churchyard and cleaning the church. I doubt if the churchyard has ever looked better for Remembrance Sunday and the church gleamed where the brasses had been cleaned, the curtains vacuumed, and the pews polished. The Gift Day raised approximately £3,000 (including reclaimed Gift Aid) which will make a major contribution to meeting our running costs and maintaining the fabric of the church.

The collection at the Remembrance Day Service enabled us to send a cheque for £298.50 to the Royal British Legion.

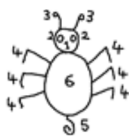

## **Nash Parish Council**

**Nash Park, unauthorised building activity.** The Parish Council await (as ever) an update from AVDC as to where they are with the enforcement of the injunction that AVDC have taken out in respect of the unauthorised development at the property. Meanwhile, if you become aware of what may appear to be unauthorised activity at the site then please contact AVDC Planning Enforcement, [PlanningEnforcement@aylesburyvaledc.gov.uk](mailto:PlanningEnforcement@aylesburyvaledc.gov.uk).

**New Unitary authority.** It has been announced by the Government a new Unitary authority will be formed in 2020 to merge Buckinghamshire County Council and AVDC. The rationale is cost saving although whether this will also provide a better service remains to be seen.

**Oxford to Cambridge Expressway and the preferred corridor.** The Government has also announced the preferred corridor for the Oxford to Cambridge Expressway. This is corridor 'B' and will go near and around Winslow. Highways England will be publishing a number of proposed routes in Autumn 2019. There will then be a period of consultation (where members of the public can comment) followed by a Public Inquiry. It is intended to start work on the approved route in 2025 with the work being completed in 2030. It should be noted that the charity BBOWT are proposing to make a legal challenge to the government's decision.

**Fly-tipping.** If you are asking a contractor to remove rubbish then you need to ensure that they are registered as an authorised waste carrier. You should therefore ask them for evidence of this. Failure to do so could lead to your prosecution should the contractor unlawfully dump your rubbish. This happened to a David Newson of Haddenham, who pleaded guilty at Wycombe Magistrates Court on Wednesday 3 October 2018 to an offence of failing in his household duty of care to properly dispose of waste. The court heard that on 19 February 2018, three sacks of household waste was found dumped off North Lee Lane, Terrick, near Aylesbury. The sacks were examined by an investigator from the Waste Partnership for Buckinghamshire, who found evidence within the waste which indicated that it came from the residence of David Newson in Haddenham. On 9 March 2018, Mr Newson voluntarily attended for an interview in Aylesbury. During the interview, he explained that he had found a 'man with a van' online and arranged collection of the waste from his house for a payment of £25. He admitted that he made no checks as to whether the man was registered as an authorised waste carrier.

The failure to make any checks on the illegal carrier meant that Newson had failed in his duty of care under the law. The Magistrates fined him £496, and ordered him to pay clean-up and prosecution costs of £1,023.56. A victim surcharge of £49 was also levied – making a total to pay of £1,568.56.

### **Nash Village Hall Social Committee**

Nash Village Hall Social Committee have ran a number of social events this calendar year and have raised the below sums, along with funds raised by the PUMP under the responsibility of Andy Thirtle as the PUMP NVHMC owner and monthly PUMP volunteers.

In conjunction with shared fundraising for the church, the fete and autumn produce show, organised by Hilary Young and team, also raised £1690.87 in June and September this year for the hall. This comes to a total of £7475.21 from all events so far this year, plus some additional pump events at the start of the year not recorded here.

Some Social Committee events also raised funds for several charities - Brain Tumour Research, Wolfhirschorn Syndrome Trust and Helen & Douglas House, all funds which were gratefully received.

Funds raised go to the upkeep of the Village Hall and enable us to continue putting further events on.

The Village Hall operates as a charity and has a number of costs in order to run successfully. The costs for this financial year from April to October were: £9,209.52. A certain level of income has come from existing and also now finished hall booking contracts, such as Montessori, and equipment hire, which have totalled to £4357.50 up to October. The full accounts of the hall will be available for viewing at the May AGM.

A big heartfelt thank you to every organiser and volunteer (from bar builders to bakers) and to all the great Nash residents, friends and family who attend and help make the events as successful as they are. They could not be put on without your support and attendance. And what a generous bunch you've been. Cheers! Look forward to plenty more lovely activities planned for next year.

There are still several more Village Hall Social Committee activities happening in the next couple of months such as the December PUMP on the 8th, the Christmas Cafe and Santa's Grotto on the 21st and a January Quiz (19th), February and March pumps (first Saturday of the month) and a February disco or cinema (16th) and March Winter BBQ (23rd). Do keep an eye out on the website and Facebook page (Nash Village Hall Social Group).

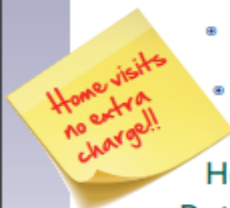

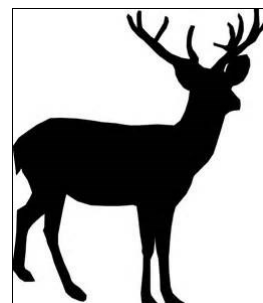

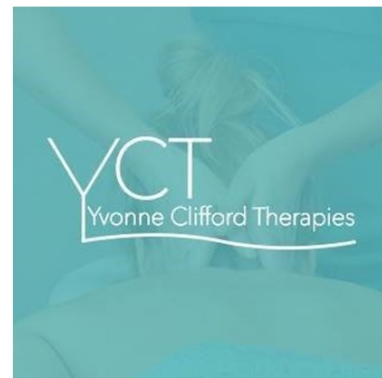

## **THE NASH PRODUCE SHOW**

This year, for the first time, the Produce Show was staged as a “stand alone” show. There was nearly an hundred entries and, despite the atrocious wet afternoon; there was an excellent turn out of people to admire the exhibits, enjoy the friendly rivalry and share tea and cake!

We are planning to stage another show next year. It will probably occur in late September and we hope that we will have even more participants.

For all you keen photographers, there will be an adult and children’s class entitled “Nash Village Life”. In addition, another adult class will be “Anything Orange”.

In the gardening section there will be the class, “Three root vegetables of any one variety”, which we have had in previous shows.

We are hoping to stage a new class, “Potato in a pot”. The idea is to grow one seed potato in a pot which can be transported to the Hall on Show day. The resulting potato crop will be publicly weighed and the heaviest crop wins. All you need is a pot, large enough to hold the potential potato crop, some soil and a MAINCROP seed potato. Seed potatoes can be bought loose at some local garden centres in late January/February. If you want any guidance on this one class, or any other, please contact Pam King, Ruth Meardon or Hilary Young.

In addition, there will be another new class for garlic growers.

“A jar of marmalade” will be a class again so, if you fancy trying your hand at making marmalade for the first time, watch out for the seville (marmalade) oranges which are due in the shops in January.

“A jar of chutney” is another class planned for 2019. As it is usual to allow at least three months for the chutney to mature before eating, we are giving you plenty of notice!

Finally, “A fruit liquor” class is to be staged again so get thinking as to what fruit you will be using for an entry.

The above classes are just the ones for which you need the most notice and to “whet your appetite”! Watch this space for more information in the coming months!
