

Nash Neighbourhood Plan

Things have continued to advance on the Nash NP front. At the Nash Parish Council meeting on 15th November the Parish Council approved the pre-submission version of the plan.

As part of this process members of the NP Committee dropped an explanatory leaflet through the letterbox of everybody in Nash, on the weekend before Christmas.

In accordance with the relevant legislation, the publication marks the beginning of a period of consultation during which the PC are seeking opinions and comments from statutory consultees, parishioners, people who work in the parish and individuals and organisations with an interest in the parish.

If you have any comment to make, even if you agree completely with the NP, please send a short email. Every comment, no matter how small will be read and included in the final submission. The more comments and suggestions the better and it can be as little as a single line email.

Nash Parish Council

2019/2020 Precept. The Parish Council Precept for the next financial year will be £13,573, an increase of £273 and 2%. However, it is understood that to date Nash Park has incorrectly been included by AVDC in their Precept calculations and as those properties (assuming they are charged Council tax) are to be moved out of Nash to Great Horwood, the actual percentage increase to residents may be higher.

Village pond. Work will be carried to clear the pond of reeds. It is hoped the work will start either later in January or early February. However, this is dependent on the contractor and the weather.

Nash Park, unauthorised building activity. The Parish Council await (as ever) an update from AVDC as to where they are with the enforcement of the injunction that AVDC have taken out in respect of the unauthorised development at the property. Meanwhile, if you become aware of what may appear to be unauthorised activity at the site then please contact AVDC Planning Enforcement, PlanningEnforcement@aylesburyvaledc.gov.uk.

The Parish Council has been notified that the **Swan Health Practice in Buckingham** will relocate from Verney Close, Buckingham, MK18 1JP to Lace Hill Development, London Road, Buckingham, MK18 1SH.

The Parish Council have been advised by Transport for Buckingham that work to the **Whaddon/ Little Horwood Roads triangle of land** is due to be carried out in this financial year. This will involve putting bollards around it to stop it being used as a short-cut or parking area.

The village annual litter collection – can you help? This will take place on Saturday 2 March, meeting in the Village Hall car park at 10.00am. It will last for 1.5-2 hours. Residents are encouraged to take part as this event plays an important role in collecting litter deposited around the village. Indeed it may be the only time that this is collected each year. It should be noted that the annual litter collection for 2018 was cancelled owing to weather conditions, so this will be the first one for two years. Please bring gloves and wear stout shoes. Rubbish bags and litter collection sticks will be provided. Please also note that residents taking part are responsible for their own safety as well as that of any children accompanying them. Each resident taking part will be entitled to a free pint of beer or glass of wine or a soft drink at the Village Pump later in the evening.

Good neighbours. From time to time the Parish Council receives complaints from residents about the actions of other residents in the village. Matters complained about have been dog waste, overgrown hedges, bonfires, parking on pavements and verges, intrusive security lights and cameras, and the use of fire-works on New Year's-eve. In some cases there is little legally that the Parish Council can do about such matters. However, such matters should not be matters of legal enforcement but rather issues that can be worked out between residents. The Parish Council would therefore ask all residents to consider their actions if these are likely to impact either directly or indirectly on other residents, and if need be discuss such action beforehand and/or give forewarning of that action. For example, there are some residents who have horses stabled in the village or who have pets and unexpected bangs and other noises from fireworks can be very unsettling for such animals (and perhaps also for some residents). Prior notice of the use of fireworks does at least allow animal owners to take precautions with their animals.

Meetings. The next meeting of the Parish Council will take place on Thursday 21 March at 7.30pm in the Village Hall. All residents of Nash are welcome to attend and speak.


