All Saints' Nash

Following Reverend Gussie Walsh's retirement, what has been happening? Well, with the growth of Buckingham town, it has been agreed that the villages of Nash, Whaddon, Beachampton and Thornborough should form a new Benefice separate from Buckingham, with its own full-time stipendiary priest. The formal legal steps for this to happen are in progress.

The new Benefice will be called the Blackthorn Chase Benefice – Chase derives from the Whaddon Chase which extended through all four villages, but there is another Chase Benefice in the Oxford Diocese, so we needed to be different. The prefix Blackthorn was chosen because of the extensive Blackthorn in the new benefice. Also, Blackthorn symbolises some of the attributes the churches seek to provide – Blackthorn is used for walking sticks which provide support, the berries provide fruit and it grows organically by spreading its roots.

The PCCs of the four churches are now preparing a profile for the new Benefice which will be available to applicants for the stipendiary position. It is intended to advertise the post in September with an appointment being made in November. Nash Church values its position in the community and will be seeking candidates who are community minded. We would be welcome comments from any-one who wishes to make an input into the "person specification", either to John Hamilton (PCC Chair), John King, or Margaret Hedges (who is editing the profile).

Nash Neighbourhood Plan

Getting there

Following a number of meetings, consultations with outside bodies and reviews of all the comments received from the publication, the Committee were pleased to be able to present the updated NP to the Nash Parish Council at their AGM on May 8th 2019, in the Village Hall, Nash.

Many changes were made, mainly around the location of the Settlement Boundary, in an attempt to reconcile as many of the comments made as possible while staying within the criteria defined by the Plan, given the criteria had met with general satisfaction.

The NP is now being reviewed by AVDC to ensure they are happy to back it when it goes to the next stage, but as soon as it is (quite possibly by the time you are reading this) it will formally be passed by the Nash PC to AVDC for the next stages.

As AVDC have explained, this "Submission" stage is where AVDC take over responsibility for taking the plan through its remaining stages and AVDC pay for everything. But it does not become AVDC's Plan. It still belongs to the people of Nash and we will still make residents aware of what is happening as it moves through the remaining stages. The parish council will still need to help AVDC with publicity at the Reg 16 stage and in making the changes to the plan following the examiner's report .

In terms of timings, it very much depends on each plan, whether NPIERS find an examiner quickly, if a hearing is needed, how many comments come in, how long it takes to process Reg 16 comments, what other work or holiday the NP examiner has over the summer, and when AVDC can find a time to get the referendum carried out. The plans all vary: it could be 8-9 months from AVDC starting the Reg 16 consultation or it could be 5-6.

We are definitely moving into the closing stage, which given we started before the BREXIT Referendum, shows just how long these things can take. But given the number of Parishes in Aylesbury Vale who have since started NPs in anticipation of huge developments between Oxford and Cambridge, we can be glad the PC made the brave decision to embark on this long term project. No "short termism" in Nash !

Nash Parish Council

The Annual Parish Meeting and the Annual Parish Council Meeting both took place on 8 May. At the Annual Parish Meeting the Chairman, Mike Williams, gave a PowerPoint presentation to those residents in attendance on the work of the Parish Council over the preceding year. Details of this can be viewed on the Parish Council website.

At the Annual Parish Council Meeting which followed the Annual Parish Meeting Mike Williams was re-elected as Chairman and David Carter as Vice-Chairman. The Parish Council's annual accounts were presented at the meeting and approved. Again details of these can be found on the website.

Nash Park, unauthorised building activity. There was concern prior to the Easter bank holiday weekend that there would be further unauthorised development on the field adjacent to the permitted site. As a result the AVDC enforcement officer was on standby and the Nash Park residents were warned that any such development would be a breach of the High Court injunction applying to the site. Nash Park was also visited regularly by Thames Valley Police (although they would not have been able to stop any such development took place and it would appear that some of the site may have been cleared, perhaps in an attempt to comply with the terms of the High Court injunction. The Parish Council understand from AVDC that legal proceedings are continuing although AVDC will not provide details so as to avoid prejudicing those proceedings.

Condition of local roads around Nash. The Parish Council have raised with BCC on several occasions the poor local road conditions. BCC have said that the surface irregularity on the Nash to Whaddon road is a long standing issue and can only be properly remedied with major reconstruction work which is not likely to happen in the short term. The Nash to Thornborough Road is due to have some more permanent repairs 'where surface conditions permit'. Nothing has been said about Thornton Road which is also in a poor condition.

Parish Clerk. I will from 1 June be stepping down as Parish Clerk after six years in the role. I am pleased to say that Ms Alison Robinson will take over from that date. Alison can be contacted using the Parish Clerk email address, nashparishclerk@gmail.com or on her mobile.

Meetings. The next meeting of the Parish Council will take place on Thursday 18 July at 7.30pm in the Village Hall. All residents of Nash are welcome to attend and speak.





