All Saints' Church

We are looking forward to welcoming the Reverend Jacqueline Dove as Rector of the new Blackthorn Chase Benefice, comprising Nash, Thornborough, Thornton, Beachampton and Whaddon.

The formal licensing by the Bishop will be on 2 September—sadly, with minimal numbers because of social distancing. Jacqueline and her husband Richard will be living in the Rectory in Chapel Lane

We were delighted that the government allowed us to start services in July—we did our risk assessment and have had three socially distanced services. It is lovely to be able to worship in the church again.

Until Jacqueline is in post, and because some clergy are self-isolating, we are restricted in the number of services that can be held in our Benefice. Each week, there will always be a service in at least one of the churches and the current plan for the start of August is:

- 2 August: Holy Communion in Thornborough (10am)
- 9 August Holy Communion in Whaddon (10am)
- 9 August Evensong at Nash (6pm)
- 16 August Holy Communion at Nash (10am)

Details will be put on the Notice Board in Stratford Road and the web-site each week. Please check, as events beyond our control may necessitate changes to our plans. Looking ahead, we hope to have some kind of Harvest Festival on Sunday 27 September but the traditional Harvest Supper and Auction that we've all so enjoyed in recent years seems unlikely to be possible within the Covid regulations.

Although services have started, because some members of the congregation are still self-isolating, we are continuing to produce a sheet with a short homily/thought for the day and prayers. Please contact Pam King if you would like a copy.

Nash Parish Council

Nash Parish Council (NPC) met remotely on 16 July 2020. The items of business dealt with at the meeting and of particular interest to the community are covered below.

Planning appeals

NPC unamoiusly endorsed the response submissions objecting to the following appeals:

- 20/00029/REF Land at Church Farm, appeal against refusal of planning application (17/04533/APP) to erect nine dwellings with associated parking and landscaping.
- 20/00028/NONDET Hatan Farm, appeal against non-determination of planning application (19/01312) to raise the eaves to provide a full two storey dwelling with additional accommodation in the roof space. Two storey side extensions (southern side) and single storey side extension (northern side). Front extension to garage with ancillary accommodation in the roof area. Change of use from agricultural land to residential garden together with the siting of two ancillary cabins for religious purposes.

Both objections have now been submitted to the Planning Inspectorate in accordance with the relevant appeal schedule.

The appeal hearing date has still yet to be announced for 19/00061/ NONDET Nash Park, appeal for non-determination of the planning application for change of use of land to 13 Gypsy/Traveller pitches with associated works including, 13 mobile homes, 13 touring caravans, 13 day rooms, and 13 cesspits.

Reopening the Children's Play Area

NPC unanimously agreed to reopen the play area as soon as possible with responsibility being placed on the users to adhere to the relevant Covid-19 guidance. Since the meeting a risk assessment has been undertaken; the vandalised perimeter fence and gates have been repaired; 2 of the 4 swings have been refitted; the play equipment has been cleaned where needed because of lack of use. Signs have been put up explaining the basis on which the play area can now be used. A big thank you to the volunteers who helped with the preparations to reopen the play area.

Please take wet wipes with you to sanitise the play equipment before it is used. Children using the play equipment in the play area should be accompanied by an adult who can ensure the safety requirements displayed by each entrance are fulfilled.

In accordance with Buckinghamshire Council guidance and for their own safety users must follow these rules when visiting the play area:

- You must maintain social distancing from other people, if it is too busy to do this please do not enter.
- Do not use the equipment if you or any member of your household has coronavirus symptoms or are self-isolating.
- Children should not use the equipment if they are clinically or extremely clinically vulnerable.
- Make sure you have hand sanitiser with you before entering the playground.
- Encourage everyone in your family to wash their hands or use hand sanitiser regularly, as a minimum before and after using the playground.
- Encourage children to avoid touching their faces.

Some equipment can only be used by one child at a time while social distancing. Please ensure your family waits at a safe distance if the equipment is in use or return later to use the equipment.

At busy times please think of others and limit your time in the play area so others may use and enjoy it too.

Please do not consume food or drink in the playground.

If your family is wearing disposable PPE, please take it home with you – don't litter.

The cost of repairing the vandalism was an unexpected expenditure which we sincerely hope won't reoccur. If you witness any vandalism whilst it is taking place, please phone 999 immediately. Any unwitnessed vandalism should be reported to the clerk (see below) so the Community Police Team can be informed.

S106 Funding

S106 funding is money from a developer which can be spent on community sports and leisure facilities. NPC is eligible to apply for £37,716 of S106 funding from 14/00534/APP.

In the past year, NPC has been exploring the viability of using these S106 funds for a project to reinstate the village pond to its orginal condition and develop the surrounding area. More recently the village enhancements working group has been investigating the possible of one or more of the following:

Adult outside gym for the recreation ground Planting mature trees Wooden pavilion/bandstand for the recreation ground Zip wire for the play area.

Unable to find a suitably qualified contractor who is willing and able to undertake the work, NPC has now agreed not to pursue the pond project at the present time and instead arrange another volunteer pond clearing weekend in September.

The zip wire and pavilion/bandstand have now been excluded on safety and use/maintenance costs respectively. There are concerns about whether the adult gym would be used suffienty to justify the expendiure and the cost of its ongoing maintenance. The planting of mature trees could cause grass cutting and other issues. In the absence of a clear consensus, NPC also agreed not to move forward with the adult gym or the mature trees at the present time.

The Village Hall Committee's interest in acquiring the schoolhouse was discussed and welcomed in principal as a once in a life-time opportunity for the community to acquire an important heritage asset. The Chair talked about several potential external funding sources and how the S106 funding could be used by NPC to demonstrate community commitment to acquiring the schoolhouse. A majority show of hands supported and encouraged the development of a detailed proposal and business plan for the acquisition of the schoolhouse – early days, but a potentially exciting proposition.

- 7) 4 eating apples of one variety, but any variety can be shown

- 1) All ages: A bunch of mixed flowers in a vase (5-10 stems)
- 2) All ages: A hedgerow arrangement in a vase
- 3) All ages: A houseplant
