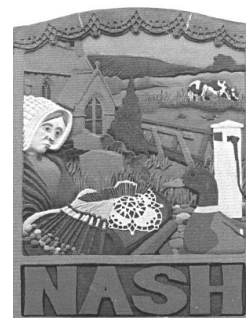

Reflection from the Rectory

My first association with Nash was working for Ducklings Montessori Nursery in the Village Hall. I particularly enjoyed walking down the footpath to the recreation ground where we would play all sorts of imaginary games. During this time a number of people at my church, St Mary's in Bletchley, started asking me if I had ever considered being ordained. I hadn't. But I had started to experience a strong sense of being called. I didn't realise this is what it was immediately. To be honest it was rather discombobulating, finding myself sobbing at the altar when receiving the chalice which seemed much larger than it actually was. I remember sitting during lunch time at Ducklings Nursery, when we got to pause awhile as the children sat eating, feeling this deep emotional longing. Rather like when

you fall in love and long to be with that person. It was particularly strong when I was at Nash. I wondered if I was home sick and longing for South Africa.

I ended up seeing a spiritual director, a priest who was also a trained therapist, as I tried to make sense of this strong, somewhat overwhelming desire to worship God with every ounce of my being. I even joked with my husband that perhaps I was being called to be a nun, he didn't think this was funny. Very slowly I came to accept I was being called by God to be ordained.

Here I am back at Nash after a very long road, which involved three years as a Chaplain in a Care Home, three and a half years studying theology part-time, being ordained and three years as a curate. When I was ordained a priest, my sobs could be heard all through the church. Sobs of relief as I felt like I was finally 'home'. So, I had been homesick after all, but not for South Africa. When I was licensed in September last year, I received a document which among other things gives me 'cure of souls' (pastoral care) for those living in the parishes I serve which includes Nash. This includes conducting Pastoral Services such as baptisms, weddings and funerals. Everyone living in the parish as the right to be baptised, married and buried by the Parish Church.

Nash Parish Council (NPC) Report

NPC most recently met on 15 July 2021. The minutes are published on the NPC noticeboard and on the NPC website: http://www.nash-bucks-pc.gov.uk/meetings_17039.aspx. The newsletter reports are intended to highlight matters of particular interest to residents.

Planning and Planning Enforcement

Planning continues to be a major area of activity. NPC responded to five planning application consultations between its meetings in May and July. A detailed consultation response has just been finalised objecting to the latest Church Farm planning application to build houses in the center of the village. More effective communication channels have been established with the Planning Enforcement Team than was previously the case. NPC was pleased to learn of the team's recent success to restrict occupation to the number of legally permitted caravans at Nash Park.

The Play Area Refurbishment

The working group met in late-June to consider presentations from Jupiter and Kompan. Both companies are currently working on revised proposals designed to ensure children of all age groups are catered for. A third company, Creative Play UK Ltd, has now been invited to quote. If possible, the working group will hold another open meeting before NPC's next meeting, on 16 September, at which the parish council hopes to be able to give approval to the project.

Pond Volunteer Weekend – Please Save the Dates 4 and 5 September

Following the success of the pond volunteers weekends in 2019 and 2020, the fun this year - and it is fun with tasks for all abilities - is tentatively scheduled to coincide with the September PUMP to allow NPC to offer the volunteers a traditional thank you with a drink of your choice. In the age of Covid there are no certainties, so the event won't be confirmed until nearer the time. Assuming it can go ahead, the format will be unchanged with the pond clearing work taking place between 10.00 – 12.00 on both days, more detailed information about clothing, foot wear and tools will be published later. Equally, he is also someone who will stop and chat with you - and you never feel you have to rush the conversation; your time is his time.

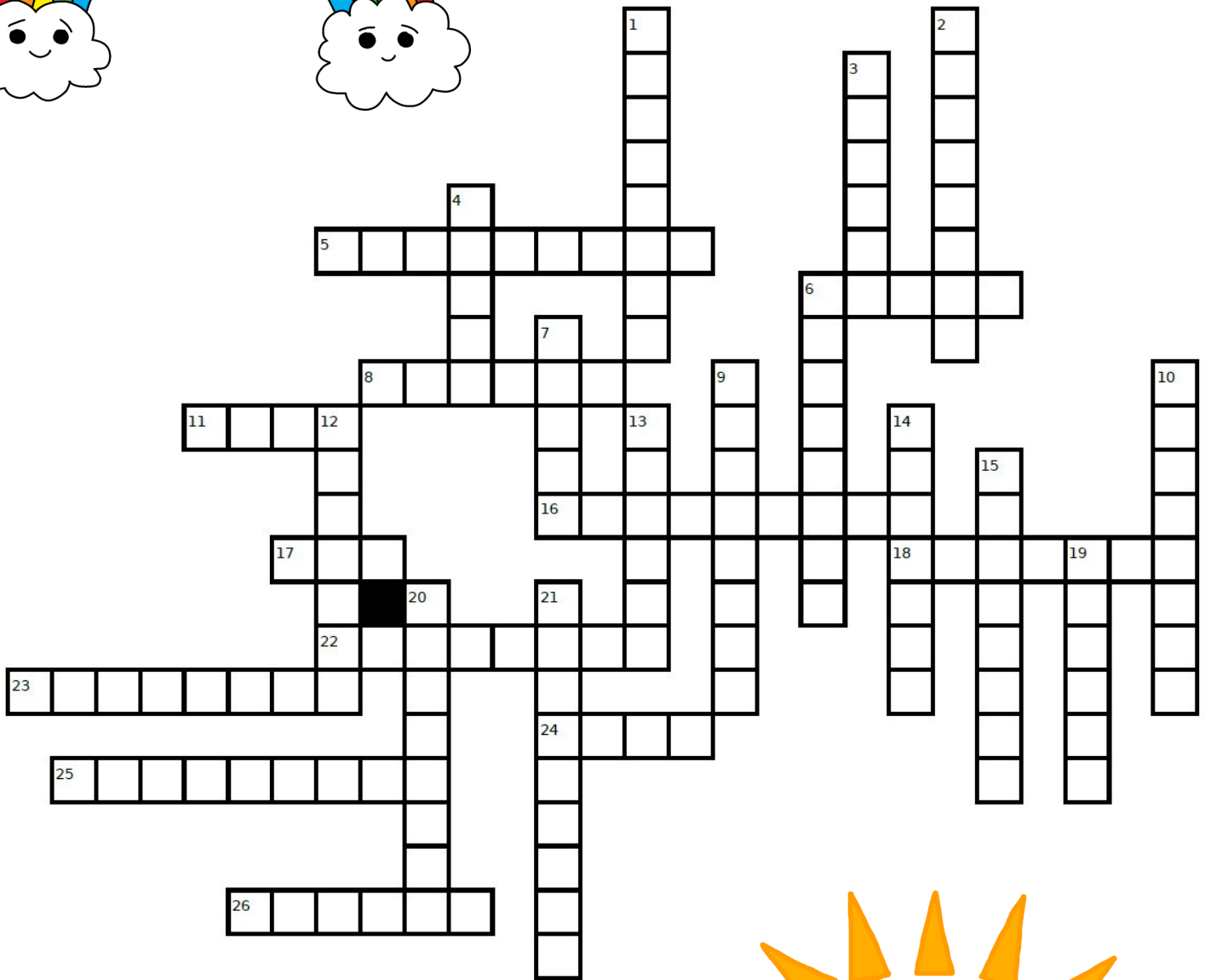
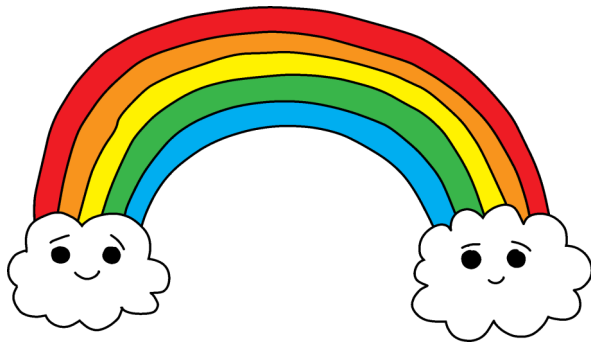
General waste: Tuesdays 10 & 24 August, 7 & 21 September

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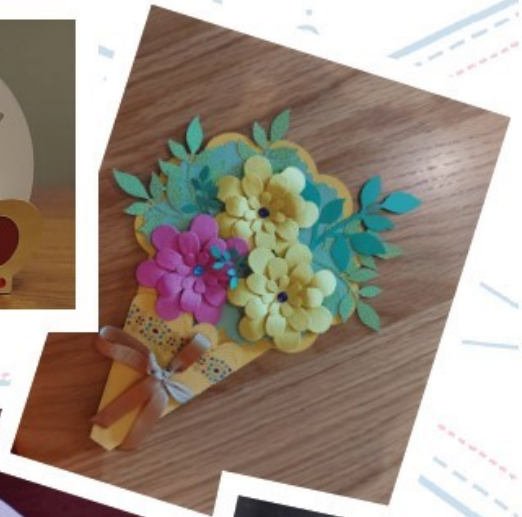

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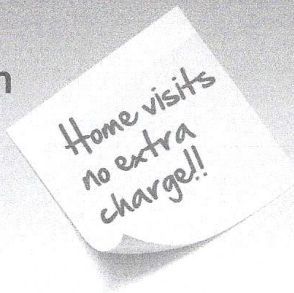

HOW TO ACCESS AND USE THE NASH VILLAGE DEFIBRILLATOR

WHAT IS A DEFIBRILLATOR OR AUTOMATIC EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR (AED)?

A defibrillator or AED is a portable defibrillator especially designed for people with little or no medical background. It is a computerised medical device that delivers an electrical current through the chest which aims to shock the heart back into a normal rhythm allowing it to pump again. Rapid response using automated technology can significantly improve the quality of life of a survivor. The longer the brain is starved of oxygen, the more damage can occur.

WHAT ARE THE PROCEDURES FOR ACCESSING THE DEFIBRILLATOR?

In an emergency you must **call 999** making sure that you give the address from which you are calling. If you use your mobile telephone, this will access any network it is able to link to, regardless of the carrier. Your mobile will transmit your GPS position.

The Nash village defibrillator is located on the wall to the right of the village hall main entrance.

HOW IS THE DEFIBRILLATOR ACTIVATED?

In all cases dial 999 first. It is really important to know that the professionals are on their way. The ambulance service will give you the access code to the defibrillator box. If you are willing, they will ask you to get this and commence the relevant actions. If you are on your own, ask friends or neighbours to collect the defibrillator from the village hall. When applied to the patient, voice commands, and screen messages will guide the user step-by-step through the process and its intelligent technology will only allow it to shock a 'shockable' heart rhythm.

DO I NEED INDEMNITY INSURANCE TO USE A DEFIBRILLATOR?

No. The patient is for all intents and purposes 'dead' when you arrive. Using cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) with a Community Public Access Defibrillator (CPAD) will hopefully bring them back to life. No one will complain about that! However, calling 999 and taking instructions from the ambulance service will automatically cover you anyway under their insurances. *Remember that you must call 999!*

DEFIBRILLATOR MAINTENANCE

The village defibrillator is checked every month by the Village Hall Maintenance Manager. The results of the checks are then recorded on the Community Heartbeat Trust website.

NOTE: These access instructions can be used anywhere. Calling 999 from your mobile will give your location. The local ambulance service will guide you to the nearest CPAD.

PLEASE KEEP THIS SHEET FOR FUTURE REFERENCE – Hopefully you will never need to use a CPAD.
